### EXAMPLE ITINERARY 1

- 9am pickup
- Visit to Broadway Tower Country Park, with unrivalled views over several counties for over 60 miles. The tower is a unique Capability Brown Folly Tower and is open to visitors all year round.
- Lunch in Broadway Village - the quintessential Cotswold village with various eateries and nostalgic shops.
- Spend the afternoon in Stow on the Wold, a typical Cotswold village boasting unique architecture and an historic Norman church or Chipping Campden, a charming, old town full of pleasing architecture and interesting shops.

### EXAMPLE ITINERARY 2

- 9am pickup
- Visit Bourton on the Water, a large Cotswold Village, complete with a beautiful landscape, a wildlife park (and Bird Land), and many more unique attractions.
- Lunch at Lords of The Manor, a beautiful Manor House Hotel situated in the village of Upper Slaughter. Lords of the Manor is a former rectory of honey-coloured stone, set in eight acres of landscaped gardens and rolling parkland.
- Spend the afternoon in Stow on the Wold, a typical Cotswold village boasting unique architecture and an historic Norman church or Chipping Campden, a charming, old town full of pleasing architecture and interesting shops.

## **HISTORIC TOUR 1**

- 9am pickup
- Visit the historic Sudeley Castle. The castle's history spans over a thousand years and contains many varied tales of royal associations, wars and periods of neglect and subsequent restoration. The award-winning Sudeley Castle Gardens have been lovingly restored and redesigned to compliment the elegance and tranquility of the castle and its ruins.
- Lunch at 5 North Street Restaurant, a small family run Michelin starred restaurant set in the ancient Cotswold town of Winchcombe.
- Spend the afternoon at Blenheim Palace, Woodstock. Home to the 11th Duke and Duchess of Marlborough, Blenheim Palace is the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill and a World Heritage Site. Blenheim Palace was a gift from Queen Anne and a grateful nation to John Churchill, 1st Duke of Marlborough following his famous victory at the Battle of Blenheim in 1704. The Churchill Exhibition includes the room where Sir Winston Churchill was born 1874. Situated in Woodstock, just 8 miles from Oxford, Blenheim Palace is surrounded by over 2,000 acres of 'Capability' Brown landscaped parkland, the great lake, and beautiful formal gardens, offering an unforgettable day out for all.
